# Vaccination Passports and Booster Shots: A How To Guide

# A. How to get a Personal Health Number

Students require a Personal Health Number to receive a BC Vaccination Passport and/or a COVID-19 Booster Shot.

### Students staying 10 months +

Students staying 10 months or longer receive a BC Services Card after the 3-month waiting period. New students may be able to receive their Personal Health Number early for use in registering for vaccinations (BC MSP does not begin for 3 months). Please contact your Homestay Coordinator for your Personal Health Number.



## **Short Term Students**

Short Term students will need to call 1-833-838-2323 to receive a temporary Personal Health Number (7am – 7pm, translators available). Explain that you are an International student and you need a temporary Personal Health Number in order to register your vaccinations QR codes from your home country. This step is required to receive a COVID booster shot.

#### B. How to register COVID vaccinations received outside of Canada to receive BC Vaccination Passport

Students will need a Personal Health Number (section A above)

If you received COVID vaccinations outside of Canada, you must register your outside of Canada proof of vaccination by going to <a href="https://www.immunizationrecord.gov.bc.ca">www.immunizationrecord.gov.bc.ca</a>

Once you have registered your outside of Canada proof of vaccination and waited 14 days, go to <a href="https://www.healthgateway.gov.bc.ca/vaccinecard">https://www.healthgateway.gov.bc.ca/vaccinecard</a> to receive a BC Vaccination Passport.

You will need the following information:

- Your name/Birthdate
- Personal Health Number
- Date of your Dose 1 and/or Dose 2 vaccination



If you do not receive your BC Vaccination Passport after 14 days, call 1-833-838-2323 for assistance.

#### C. How to receive a COVID-19 Booster shot

Once your Out-of-Canada vaccines have been registered and approved, you will be contacted by email or text message with an invitation to receive a COVID-19 Booster shot. This should occur 6 months after you received your 2<sup>nd</sup> dose.
