





International Education in Canada



Importance of Homestay




- Parents from around the world entrust the safety and well-being of their children
- Welcoming families embracing students as their own family members.
- Family environment for authentic cultural and language learning





- Abide by all rules /guidelines established by the program
- Be 25 years old or older
- Agree to scheduled in-home inspections and criminal record checks
- Have no more than 2 international students
- Provide food for 3 nutritious meals per day
- Provide a clean and tidy home with a private, furnished bedroom
- Ensure the house is safe and complies with building bylaws
- Ensure the home and auto insurance are adequate





CENTRAL OKANAGAN PUBLIC SCHOOLS GUIDELINES FOR HOMESTAY

Province of British Columbia and B.C. school district international student programs are proud of B.C.'s fd class obtaction system, our velcoming communities and our incredible natural environment. cognizing that homestay plays a pivotal role in an international student's experience, B.C. is committed to h-quality homestay experiences for call students.

homestay is a formal arrangement by an international student program to house an international student with approved family during the course of study. The guidelines refer to this family as the 'host family'. A meansy student is a minor child from outide BC, who pays face to atay with a homestay family in return r meals, a private room, family support, and various cultural experiences.

Students and homestay families understand that the homestay student relationship is not that of landlord and tenant, bit rather one of mutual support where the student will conform to the normal rules of the family life and contribute to the operation of the household and the homestay family will care for the student and include the student in their regular activities as they would any of their children.

EXPECTATIONS OF HOST PARENTS

- To promote the best possible homestay experience for international students, host family parent(s) w • Provide a caring, safe, nurturing, and supportive home environment for your student.
- Provide a carear, and any provide, advanted to furnished be forcom, with a ccess with a desk, chair and adequate lighting for homework, and a bathroom, linens and use o
- facilities. • Provide food for three nutritious meals and snacks per day.
- Ensure a student's general well-being, seek medical attention when necessary, and report any
 significant medical or mental health issues to the school, the custodian, the homestay coordinator, a
 the international student program.
- Provide access to the internet to support education goals and consistent communications with home.
 Ensure your student attends school and is punctual for classes and maintain contact with our program
- regarding concerns with student progress, attendance, or behavior. • Pick up and deep off international student at the Kelowna International Airport upon arrival and at the time of denarture.
- Abide by all nules/guidelines established by the homestay program provider when hosting a student placed by that provider.
- Inform the school or international student program if the student drinks alcohol, takes or possesses non-prescribed, illegal drugs or breaks the law.

Host Parent Responsibilities

- 1. Provide a caring, nurturing and supportive home environment
- 2. Provide regular, nutritious meals and snacks
- 3. Monitor and support the physical and emotional well-being of student.
- 4. Assist in seeking medical attention when necessary.
- 5. Monitor school engagement, absences and punctuality
- 6. Maintain contact with school/program concerning student progress
- 7. Promote strong connections between student, parents, schools and communities
- 8. <u>Communicate</u> with homestay coordinator regarding issues, safety & medical concerns, overnight travel outside of city limits
- 9. Inform the program if student uses drugs or alcohol or breaks the law

Communication is KEY to a successful program





IMPORTANT CONSIDERATIONS

- ✓ Freedom of belief (religious, political, gender, etc.)
- ✓ Students are not to take driving lessons or drive while in our program
- ✓ No riding with an "L" drivers.
- ✓ No riding with "N" drivers to school functions during school hours.
- Check your email daily and our website periodically
- Homestay commitment is until June 30. Please do not invite students to stay past June 30.
- Student can be moved without notice by our program at any time. However, we strive to resolve and mediate issues prior to moving students unless it is an emergency
- Cannot host for other schools, programs or agencies while hosting a SD23 student
- ✓ Inform Home Insurance that a non-family member is living in your home



Compensation

Full Month

The monthly compensation rate for hosting a student is \$1000 for a full month.

\$1100 per month starting Sept. 2023

Partial Months

Partial months are pro-rated at a rate of \$34 per day. (\$37 per day for 2023/24)

Partial months are most common during

- Arrivals
- Departures
- Student homestay moves

Method of Payment:

Direct Deposit payments made at the end of the month.


Maintain contact with school and our program concerning student progress

- Illness that requires medical attention




Medical – How students are covered



Students registered in the Central Okanagan Public Schools International Program will receive medical insurance through Study Insured.

How to Submit a Claim to Study Insured

Claims under \$500

If your claim is under \$500, you may not need to submit a claim form. You can just email studentclaims@studyinsured.com

In your email include the following;

- Full legal name
- Study Insured Policy number
- · Copies of your receipts, invoices, referrals (scan or photograph attached to email)
- Any other supporting medical documents that you were provided ex: medical notes, reports, etc. (scan or photograph attached to email)
- Full mailing address

Travel Policies

Families are encouraged to include student in family vacation plans

Host family should provide accommodation, meals and transportation (excluding air travel) Please have a conversation with your student in advance if additional cost are required

Student provide cost of activities and spending money

Confirm that student has necessary travel documents needed if traveling to another country (Visa or ESTA)



Travel With Host Families

Travel within BC

- Email the homestay coordinator with details of <u>any overnight trips</u> including dates, destination and contact information.
- Contact the school to excuse your student from school

Travel outside of BC

- Submit a completed Travel Request Form . This form includes a section that requires a signature of the natural parent(s).
- Completed travel forms must be submitted to Homestay Coordinator.
- Travel by airplane must be **pre-approved** prior to booking flights
- Contact the school to excuse your student from school during the trip.

Travel outside of Canada

- Submit a completed <u>Travel Request Form</u>. This form includes a section that requires a signature of the natural parent(s).
- All travel outside of Canada must be pre-approved by the program at least two weeks prior to the planned trip
- International travel may require special documentation such as Visa, ESTA

Respite

If student is unable to travel with family

Host family is responsible to make alternate arrangements with another host family from our program when possible

Host family needs to confirm details with Homestay Coordinator in advance.

Compensation for host families who hosts your student when your family is away (\$34/\$37 per night to be paid at drop-off time)

If alternate supervisory arrangements are made, the supervisor must be over 25 and have a CRC (not staying with a program homestay family)

You must inform your Homestay Coordinator of <u>ALL</u> respite arrangements.

Golden Rules for your Homestay

- 1. Your host family must know where you are at all times and approve of what you are doing.
- Ask , don't tell, your host family of your plans ahead of time. Don't surprise your host family with a last minute change of plans.
 - After school activities
 - Plans with friends
 - Meals away from home
- 3. Balance socializing with friends with spending time with your host family.
- 4. Keep your Canadian cell phone working and always have it with you.
- Your host family is not a taxi service! Your host family should be available to drive you to
 occasional social events and activities (ask in advance). Learn how to be independent biking,
 bus, etc.
- 6. Follow the rules of the household
 - Quiet hours
 - Curfew
 - Chores / keep bedroom and bathroom clean
 - o Food
 - Healthy electronic use
- It is not an "open" kitchen. Host family is responsible to provide 3 meals and sensible snacks. Buy extra food if necessary.
- 8. Limit technology when your family is present.
- 9. Be polite with your words and body language.
- 10. Discuss concerns early and respectfully. Involve your homestay coordinator if necessary.
