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
#### **Introduction and Program Calendar**

## Central Okanagan International Education Program Dates 2023 - 2024





**COVID-19 Travel** - Emergency border measures have ended as of October 1, 2022

- Proof of COVID-19 vaccination is not required
- COVID-19 pre-entry and arrival tests are not required
- Quarantine after you enter Canada is not required
- Using ArriveCAN is not required
  - To save time at the border, you can still use ArriveCAN to complete your customs and immigration declaration before flying into Canada. Download the <u>ArriveCAN</u> app
- Health checks to board planes and trains are **not required**
- Wearing masks on planes and trains is not required, but recommended

If you have symptoms of COVID-19, you should not travel to Canada – reschedule.

### **Pre-Departure**

#### **Communication & Relationship Building**

Contact your host family to get to know each other. A video chat using Zoom or Skype is a good way to do this. Remember to exchange emails and cell phone numbers with your host family.

## Packing your Carry-on Luggage

Include the following in your carry-on bag:

- A copy of this document
- Passport
- Custodianship Documents
- Letter of Acceptance
- Letter of Introduction or Study Permit
- Host Family Profile with contact information
- Face mask and hand sanitizer
- Snacks
- Smart phone and charger
- Change of clothes, prescription medication (if needed).





## **Best Practices for Airport and Flight**

#### Be Early

Airports have been busy. Please arrive early to allow plenty of time to check-in and go through security.



**Practice Good Hygiene** It is recommended to wear a mask. Wash your hands frequently.



#### Stay Connected


Keep your cell phone charged in case you need to contact your host family. Free wi-fi is available in all Canadian airports.



#### **Flight Changes**

Students are asked to contact our **Emergency Phone line** +1-250-801-5684 if their arrival time changes or if they need any assistance during their travels. Students should also contact their homestay family if their arrival time at the Kelowna International Airport is changed.





4. Find the gate to your connecting flight.

- 1. Contact your host family when you land in Canada.
  - Let your host family know you have arrived.
  - Update your expected arrival time in Kelowna.
  - Airports have free wi-fi or activate your PhoneBox sim card in advance.
- 2. Have documents ready to show the immigration officer.
  - Passport

Arrival in Canada – step by step

- Letter of Acceptance
- Custodial Declaration
- ArriveCAN App receipt (if you choose to use ArriveCan)
- Host family profile
- Letter of Introduction from Government of Canada (Study Permit approval letter)

6. Board your flight to Kelowna - your new home in the Central Okanagan.

- 7. Meet your host family at the Kelowna Airport (YLW). Your host family will be at the airport to welcome you.

Contact your host family if there are changes to your arrival time.











## After Arrival - What To Do

#### **Get To Know Your Homestay**

Get to know the members of your host family as well as the rules and routines of your home. Be sure to learn how to properly use the kitchen, washroom and laundry facilities. Have some fun!

#### **Stay Connected**

Let your homestay family know if you need anything. Check with your host family to make sure you have access to wi-fi. Contact your friends and family. It is important to check your email regularly for school and program updates.

#### Look In Your Welcome Bag

At the airport you will receive a Welcome Bag. Please look for;

- Things to do in the Central Okanagan during your first weeks
- Arrival week activity Beach rental of paddleboard, water bike, etc.
- Monthly activities to look forward to during the year
- Optional sightseeing trip offerings for 2023/24
- SIM card from PhoneBox

#### **Student Responsibilities**

To keep you and your host family safe, it is important that you practice good hygiene. Some examples are washing your hands often, showering every day, cleaning the bathroom after using it, covering your mouth and nose with your elbow when you cough and sneeze.

#### Stay Healthy at School – Mental Wellness Phone Line

You have 24-hour access to our on-line counselling program -provides counselling in multiple languages. **1-866-883-9787** 

This program has trained counsellors who understand cultural differences and specialize in working with international students.













#### WHAT TO BRING

- Clothing for four seasons. Packing for all seasons is important. Students will have time to shop throughout the year if they need to purchase winter clothing.
- Athletic shoes and gym strip for Physical Education classes.
- Swimsuit for indoor and outdoor water activities
- Prescription medicine (if applicable)
- Basic school supplies
- Cell phone you will need a Canadian cell number

#### **CELL PHONE PLANS**

You must have a phone number that is free to use (and free for others to call you) in Canada.

There is an option for students to obtain a Canadian phone number and mobile phone plan prior to arrival. Alternately, sim cards from PhoneBox will be in the student welcome bags they receive at the airport upon arrival for those that would like to use the service. <u>https://try.gophonebox.com/newarrivals/</u>



#### ORIENTATION

Your homestay coordinator and school will provide orientation in the first few days you arrive. These dates will communicated by your homestay coordinator.

#### **GETTING READY FOR SCHOOL**

#### **SCHOOL SUPPLIES**

Most courses do not require any special school supplies. Students will need basic supplies such as lined paper (8 ½" x 11" with 3 holes), 3 ring binders, notebooks, pens, pencils, a calculator, an eraser, and a ruler. Students will also need athletic shoes and clothing for PE classes. Teachers will inform their students of any special supplies that are required on the first day of classes.

#### **FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL**

The first day of Semester 2 is Tuesday January 30<sup>th</sup>. Buses run as scheduled in the morning and depart the school after early dismissal. Your homestay family will help you with how to get to school the first day and finding your bus stop.



#### **STAY INFORMED**

#### GET TO KNOW YOUR SCHOOL WEBSITE

Get familiar with your schools website. The websites have a lot of useful information about your school. For your first days, you will want to know the bell schedule and block rotation of your classes. Your school website can be found on the <u>district school directory</u>.

#### CHECK YOUR EMAIL REGULARLY

After arrival, important program information is sent to the students email entered in the application. Students should check their email daily so they do not want to miss out on information about activities, sightseeing trips, skiing/snowboarding, and many other opportunities.

## **Travel and Arrival Protocol Checklist**

#### **Pre-Departure**

- □ Contact host family
  - O Introduce yourself
  - O Discuss expectations
  - O Make sure they have a current photo
  - O Provide arrival information and exchange contact information (cell & email)
- Optional: Download the <u>ArriveCAN</u> app and complete tasks at least 72 hours before arrival.
- $\Box$  In carry on, pack the following:
  - O Passport and study permit
  - O Custodianship documents/Letter of Acceptance
  - O Letter of Introduction (study permit approval) if staying more than 6 months
  - O Host family profile and contact information
  - Copy of this document (Student Arrival Guide)

#### **Airport and In-Flight**

- □ Wear a mask (recommended)
- □ Wash hands frequently or use hand sanitizer
- □ Keep cell phone charged

#### Arrival in Canada

- □ Contact host family and confirm pick up point.
- □ Have all documents ready to proceed through immigration.
- □ Get your Study Permit processed at Immigration first port of entry (if applicable you are staying longer than 6 months).

#### Arrival in Kelowna

- □ Meet your homestay family and International Education staff.
- □ Get your Welcome Bag.
- □ International Education staff to scan your Study Permit (if you need one).

#### **In Homestay**

- □ Your homestay family will provide you with food, a comfortable room, and Wi-Fi access.
- □ Get to know your homestay family.
- □ Learn the rules and expectations of your homestay.
- □ Stay connected with friends, family, and homestay coordinator.
- □ Practice good hygiene, monitor your physical and mental well-being. If you are not feeling well, let your host family know.
- □ Check your email daily for information from our program.
- □ Ask for help from your host family or homestay coordinator if you need it.
