

Your First Few Days

Contact home

Your parents will want to hear from you. Let them know you have safely arrived.



Ask questions

Your host family wants you to feel at home and help you settle in. If you do not understand something, please ask them for what you need.



Tour your home & neighborhood

Ask your host family to give you a <u>tour</u> of your house, yard & neighborhood.



Learn house rules & routines

Review the rules and routines of your homestay. Learn how to use household items correctly (kitchen, laundry, shower, toilet, etc.)



Unpack

Unpack your belongings and get comfortable. Your room should have a desk, chair, bed, bedding, lamp and closet or dresser.



Store your passport

Find a safe place to store your <u>passport</u> and other important documents. Only carry your passport when you are travelling across border.



Photo important cards

Take a photo of both sides of your <u>emergency card</u> and your <u>insurance card</u>. Enter the emergency number and your host parent(s) numbers in your phone.



Sign up for a Canadian phone plan

You must have a phone number you can use with or without wifi. It also needs to be no cost for others to contact you. You can use a PhoneBox sim card if you need to set up a Canadian number.

Program Expectations - Positive Experience

Be open to new things

Enjoy your school and homestay experience to the fullest in Canada. Be open to new experiences and Canadian culture.



Ask for support

Talk to your host parents and/or your homestay coordinator if you are having problems or if you are feeling down.



Follow the rules

Your host family will have expectations and rules for their home. Respect and follow the homestay rules and our program's "Golden Rules" for living in a homestay.



Clean up after vourself

Keep you room and bathroom clean and organized. Clean up after yourself in the house when you use something.



Get involved with your family

Your host family wants to spend time with you and share their family time with you. Be open to spending time with them and participating in their daily activities.



Get involved in school and the community

Ask your international coordinator at school how to find out about school events.

Do your best in school. Ask your teachers for help if you do not understand. Speak English as much as you can.



Program Expectations - Rules

Review student expectations

Take time to review the expectations for international students on the program <u>website</u>.



Follow all BC & Canada laws

While in our program students much follow all the laws of BC & Canada at all times. Ask your host family or homestay coordinator if you are unsure about Canada or BC laws.



No alcohol or drugs

Students are <u>not</u> allowed to use drugs or drink alcohol at any time during their time in Canada and in the program.



No smoking or vaping

Smoking cigarettes or using vape products are <u>not</u> allowed in our program.




No driving

International students are <u>not</u> allowed to drive while in Canada and in the program.



Attend school

You must attend school every day unless you are sick. Missing school for no reason is called "skipping". In Canada, students who skip school may be suspended from school.



Plagiarism

Plagiarism is a serious offense in schools. Students cannot copy work from the internet, books, or other students. Copying other work is considered cheating. Students may be suspended from school for plagiarism. If you do not understand an assignment, ask for help. Teachers, staff and host parents will be happy to help you with your work.

Police, Ambulance, Fire

Police officers (RCMP) will help you with <u>emergency</u> and non-emergency police related issues. RCMP liaison officers also work in all our schools. Police officers in Canada are very helpful.


Submitting an Insurance Claim

Study Insured Assistance may instruct students to complete a claim form for claims under \$500 in special circumstances.

Collect all invoices, receipts, doctor's notes, ER reports, etc. as they must be submitted with the claim (many medical facilities will send this direct, however, you should get your own copies just in case).



Medical Services Card

After 3 months, full year students will also have medical coverage through the provincial health plan. Your homestay coordinator will deliver your <u>BC MSP</u> card when it arrives. Once you have your BC MSP card, please present this card when you seek medical attention. Study Insured becomes extended medical coverage after MSP is in place.

- Supervise and keep you safe
- Set your curfew
- Give you permission to go out
- Report unsafe situations to the program

Legal Custodians

- Make decisions for your well-being
- Support host families and homestay coordinators
- Create procedures and rules for your safety
- Communicate with your agent

- Help you at school
- Answer your questions about the school, your courses, teachers, and activities
- Plan school activities
- Teach ELL/ESL and other subjects
- Help you plan for college/university

Transportation

You will either be able to walk to school, receive a school bus pass, or purchase a city bus pass.

If your host parents drive their other children to school, they will drive you too.



Your host parents will provide transportation to and from events a reasonable amount of the time. Give them plenty of notice if you need a ride and always ask politely.




Seatbelt use in cars is mandatory in Canada. If you are the only passenger in the car, it is customary to sit in the front seat.



Walking

Use sidewalks when they are available.





City Bus

You can use the city bus to get around the Central Okanagan. For routes, maps and general info go to the BC Transit WEBSITE

Transportation

School Bus

Some students go to school by yellow school bus.



Your homestay coordinator will register you for the school bus if you are eligible.

Your host family will show you where to find the bus stop near your house.

Transportation

Riding with Friends

You can ride in a car with adults with a driver's license.



You can ride in a car with N drivers if they are following ALL restrictions for their license (i.e., you are the <u>only passenger</u> or if they are only driving their family members and you).



You <u>cannot</u> ride alone with L drivers. You <u>cannot</u> drive when you are in the program.

The closest airport is Kelowna International Airport (YLW) https://ylw.kelowna.ca





You need permission from our program to travel outside of the Central Okanagan.

Money

Canadian currency has both coins and paper money.

There are 100 cents in one dollar.

Paper Money: \$100, \$50, \$20, \$10, \$5 bills.

Coins: 5ϕ (nickel) / 10ϕ (dime) / 25ϕ (quarter) \$1.00 (dollar/loonie) / \$2.00 (toonie)

Big White Ski Resort Season Pass

Many students enjoy skiing and snowboarding in the winter months in the Central Okanagan. Below are instruction on how to purchase a season's pass from Big White. You will need natural parent permission confirmed through this process.



- ☐ Step 1: Students purchase the pass online
- ☐ Step 2: Parents email <u>tickets@bigwhite.com</u> stating that they have bought the pass online and need to sign the online waiver
- ☐ Step 3: The Big White ticket office will send the parents consent instructions.
- ☐ Step 4: Once this has been completed and verified Big White can update the student profile.
- ☐ Step 5: Students collect their passes in Canada at the Big White Ticket office.
