

This number is monitored 24/7 by staff members who can help.

Cell Phone in Canada



For safety reasons it is a requirement that all international students have a Canadian phone number during their time in Central Okanagan.

- A Canadian phone number is needed to connect with 911 services.
- The Program Emergency Phone line is unable to receive calls from apps such as What's App.
- Students need to be reachable by their host family and the program staff when they are not on a Wi-Fi network.




\mathbf{Q} PhoneBox (one option)

- PhoneBox[™] is offering a Winter Student Special which includes a \$10 discount on monthly plans: PhoneBox[™] Winter Student Special
- Set up before arriving in Canada or you can request a physical PhoneBox™ SIM card at Student Orientation after arriving in Canada.

Connect with your Family in Canada



- Contact your Canadian family to get to know each other.
- Discuss expectations (yours and theirs).
- Having a video chat (What'sApp, Facetime, etc.) is a good way to do this.





Medical Insurance

You will receive medical insurance through StudyInsured™.

studyinsured™



- Your medical wallet card and policy number will be sent to your email the month before you begin your program.
- You will also receive copy of this information after arriving in Canada.
- Detailed coverage information can be found here Medical Insurance.



- Additional services are available to students through StudyInsured[™].
 - Virtual Health Service Licensed doctor available by secure video chat.
 - Stay Healthy at School Mental health counselling offered in person, by video, or by phone. Available in 190 languages.

What to bring to the Central Okanagan

- Cell phone with a Canadian phone plan
- Clothing for four seasons
 - You will have time to shop after arrival if you need to purchase winter clothing
- Athletic shoes and gym clothing for Physical Education classes and some Program activities
- Swimsuit for water activities
- Prescription medication (if applicable)

Be Early

Arrive early to allow plenty of time to check-in and go through security.



Stay Connected

- Keep your cell phone charged in case you need to contact the International Program or your Canadian family.
- Free Wi-Fi is available in all Canadian airports.

Flight Changes

- Contact our Emergency Phone 1-250-801-5684:
 - o If your flight time changes to Kelowna International Airport.
 - If you need any assistance during your travels.
- You also need to contact your Canadian family if your arrival time to Kelowna International Airport changes.

Arrival in Canada – Step by Step

- 1. Have documents ready when entering Canada (at your first Canadian airport).
 - Passport
 - Letter of Acceptance
 - Letter of Introduction from Government of Canada, the Study Permit approval letter
 (if applicable, for student studying 6+ months)
 - Custodial Declaration
 - Address that you will be living at when in Canada
- 2. Speak with a Border Services Officer to indicate the purpose for your arrival in Canada.
 "I have been accepted into the Central Okanagan International Education Program."
 "I will be studying at [name of school] from January 26 until June 22, 2026."



Very important: Students staying in Canada longer than 6 months MUST have a Study Permit.

- 3. With approval from the Border Services Officer, proceed to the Immigration Office with your Letter of Introduction from the Government of Canada.
 - Get your Study Permit processed AND printed.
 - This MUST be done at the first Canadian Airport you arrive at (ex. Calgary, Montral, Toronto, Vancouver).





4. Find the gate to your connecting flight.



5. Contact the Emergency Phone **1-250-801-5684** and your Canadian family if there are any changes to your arrival time at Kelowna International Airport.



6. Board your flight to Kelowna International Airport - your new home as a student in the Central Okanagan International Education Program.



7. If you are in our homestay program, YOU WILL BE MET BY YOUR HOST FAMILY at the airport.



Delayed? Missed a flight? Please call the Emergency Phone **1-250-801-5684 AND** inform your host family.



After Arrival - What to Do

Stay Connected

- Check to make sure you have access to Wi-Fi.
- Contact your parents to let them know you arrived safely.



Get To Know Your Canadian Family

- Get to know the members of the family you are living with.
- Discuss the rules, expectations, and routines of your home.
- Be sure to learn how to properly use the kitchen, washroom, and laundry facilities.
- Have fun!

Unpack

- Unpack your belongings and get comfortable.
- Your room should have a desk, chair, bed, bedding, lamp and closet or dresser.
- Let your Canadian family know if you need anything.

Talk to your Supports

- Let your Program Manager know if you need anything.
- If you are feeling homesick talk to your host family, Program Manager, or contact your agent.

Keep up with Program and School Information

- Check iCent and your email regularly for important information.
 - o Program information is sent to the email you listed in your application.
 - o Make sure you do not miss information about:
 - School & program updates
 - Activities & sightseeing trips
 - Skiing/snowboarding information











New International Student Orientation

Monday, January 26, 2026

You will receive more information through email and iCent about student orientation closer to your arrival.

- Canadian families will help you with your transportation to/from the school (either by city bus or school bus).
- Please arrive at least 10 minutes before orientation begins.
- When arriving at the school, enter through the main doors.
 - Your Program Manager will be there to check you in.
- Lunch and snacks will be provided.
- Class schedules will be provided during orientation.
- You will receive a welcome bag.
- Dress in comfortable school appropriate clothing for participation in activities.
- Some students will also complete their English Assessment on this day (if validating your studies, graduating, or requiring special documentation).

As a student in our Program, you are expected to follow all rules and expectations of international students at school, as well as when you are in the Central Okanagan community and in other parts of Canada. During student orientation international student rules and expectations will be reviewed. They are also available and/or discussed:

- In the International Student Handbook and on the International Education website.
- During school lunch meetings.
- When having conversations with school and Program staff and your host family.

It is the responsibility of the student to understand and follow the rules and expectations. If you are unsure of a rule or expectation, it is <u>your responsibility</u> to ask an adult for clarification.

Look In Your Welcome Bag

At student orientation you will receive a Welcome Bag. Please look for:

- Some snacks to enjoy after your trip.
- An arrival gift and information.
- Monthly activities to look forward to during the year.
- Things to do in the Central Okanagan during your first weeks.





First Day of School

- The first day of Semester 2 classes is Tuesday, January 27th.
- Students only attend for a half day on the first day of school.
- School buses run as regularly scheduled.
- Secondary school (grades 9-12) begins at 09:00 am in Central Okanagan.



School Supplies

- You can bring supplies with you or buy them in Canada.
- Most courses do not require any special school supplies.
 - Teachers will inform you on the first day of classes about any special supplies that are required for their class.
 - o You will have time to purchase these supplies before needing them in class.
- You are <u>not</u> required to bring a laptop or tablet for school purposes. Teachers plan activities and ensure there are the devices needed at the school for those activities.

Check iCent and your Email Regularly

- Important program information is sent to the email you entered in your application.
- While in Canada you should check iCent daily.
 - You do not want to miss out on information about activities, sightseeing trips, skiing/snowboarding, and many other opportunities.

Travel and Arrival Checklist

Pre-Departure



- ☐ Add the Emergency Phone number to your contacts on your phone.
- ☐ Register for a Canadian cell phone number.
- ☐ Contact the family you will be living with in Canada and introduce yourself.
 - O Make sure they have a current photo of you.
 - O Provide arrival information and exchange contact information (cell phone & email).
- ☐ Pack the following in your carry-on bag:
 - 1. Passport
 - 2. Documents for the Canadian Border:
 - a) Letter of Acceptance
 - b) Letter of Introduction from Government of Canada (if staying more than 6 months)
 - c) Custodianship Declaration
 - d) Address you will be living at when studying in Canada.
 - 3. Your StudyInsured™ policy number
 - 4. Prescription medication (if applicable). Do not place in checked luggage.
 - 5. Phone, charging cord, and power pug travel adapter (if applicable)
 - 6. Copy of this ARRIVAL Guide



At the Airport and In-Flight


- \square Arrive early for your flights.

- ☐ If staying longer than 6 months proceed to Immigration Office.

Arrival in your Canadian Home

- ☐ Get to know your Canadian family.

 - o Get set up with Wi-Fi access.
 - o Connect with friends and family.
- ☐ Check your email and iCent daily (until the first week of school is completed) for information from our program.
