Cell Phone in Canada



- You must have a phone number and plan that is free for your family in Canada and the Program to contact you while you are here.
- You must be reachable when you are not on a Wi-Fi network.
- You arrange for a Canadian phone number & plan before arriving.



\mathbf{Q} PhoneBox (one option)

- You will have the SIM card fee waived if choose to register for a phone plan through PhoneBoxTM https://welcome.gophonebox.com/studyinsured/
- Set up a mobile phone plan in August and get an eSIM after receiving the email with your insurance policy information from StudyInsured™.

Connect with your Family in Canada



- Contact your Canada family to get to know each other.
- Discuss expectations (yours and theirs).
- A video chat using What'sApp, Facetime, Zoom or Teams is a good way to do this.

 Exchange emails and cell phone numbers with them so you can update them during your travel here.



Medical Insurance

You will receive medical insurance through StudyInsured™.

- Your medical wallet card and policy number will be sent to your email the month before you begin your program.
- You will also receive copy of this information after arriving in Canada.
- Detailed coverage information can be found here Medical Insurance.



- Additional services are available to students through StudyInsured[™].
 - Virtual Health Service Licensed doctor available by secure video chat.
 - Stay Healthy at School Mental health counselling offered in person, by video, or by phone. Available in 190 languages.

Be Early

• Arrive early to allow plenty of time to check-in and go through security.



Stay Connected

- Keep your cell phone charged in case you need to contact the International Program or your Canadian family.
- Free Wi-Fi is available in all Canadian airports.

Arrival in Canada – Step by Step

- 1. Have documents ready when entering Canada (at your first Canadian airport).
 - Passport
 - Letter of Acceptance
 - Letter of Introduction from Government of Canada, the Study Permit approval letter (if applicable)
 - Custodial Declaration
 - Address that you will be living at when in Canada
- Speak with a Border Services Officer to indicate the purpose for your arrival in Canada.
 "I have been accepted into the Central Okanagan International Education Program."
 "I will be studying at [name of school] from Sept. 3rd 2024, until [your program end date]."



Very important: Students staying in Canada longer than 6 months MUST have a Study Permit.

- 3. With approval from the Border Services Officer, proceed to the Immigration Office with your Letter of Introduction from the Government of Canada.
 - Get your Study Permit processed AND printed.
 - This **MUST** be done at the first Canadian Airport you arrive at.





4. Find the gate to your connecting flight.



5. Contact the Emergency Phone Line **1 250 801 5684** and your Canadian family if there are any changes to your arrival time at Kelowna International Airport.



6. Board your flight to Kelowna International Airport - your new home as a student in the Central Okanagan International Education Program.



7. If you are in our homestay program, **YOU WILL BE MET BY YOUR HOST FAMILY** and International Education staff at the airport.

After Arrival - What to Do

Stay Connected

- Check to make sure you have access to Wi-Fi.
- Contact your parents to let them know you arrived safely.



Get To Know Your Canadian Family

- Get to know the members of the family you are living with.
- Discuss the rules, expectations, and routines of your home.
- Be sure to learn how to properly use the kitchen, washroom, and laundry facilities.
- Have fun!

Unpack

- Unpack your belongings and get comfortable.
- Your room should have a desk, chair, bed, bedding, lamp and closet or dresser.
- Let your Canadian family know if you need anything.

Look In Your Welcome Bag

At the airport you will receive a Welcome Bag. Please look for:

- Some snacks to enjoy after your trip.
- Arrival week activity information beach rental of paddleboard, water bike, etc.
- Optional sightseeing trip offerings for 2024/2025.
- Monthly activities to look forward to during the year.
- Things to do in the Central Okanagan during your first weeks.

Talk to your Supports

- Let your Homestay Coordinator know if you need anything.
- If you are feeling homesick talk to your host family, homestay coordinator, or contact your agent.

Keep up with Program and School Information

- Check your email regularly for important information.
 - o Program information is sent to the email you listed in your application.
 - o Make sure you do not miss information about:

- Canadian families will help you with your transportation to and from the school.
 - o School buses will not be running on these days.
- Please arrive at least 10 minutes before orientation begins.
- When arriving at the school, enter through the main doors.
 - o Your homestay coordinator will be there to check you in.
- Lunch and snacks will be provided.
- Class schedules will be provided during orientation.
- Dress in comfortable school appropriate clothing so you can participate in activities.
- Some students will also complete their English Assessment on this day (if convalidating, graduating, or requiring special documentation).





First Day of School

- The first day of school is Tuesday September 3rd.
- This is a half day (morning only).
- School buses run as regularly scheduled in the morning.
 - o Buses will depart the school after early dismissal.
- School in Canada for middle and high school students typically begins at 9am.

School Supplies

- You can bring supplies with you or buy them in Canada.
- Most courses do not require any special school supplies.
 - Teachers will inform you on the first day of classes about any special supplies that are required for their class.
 - o You will have time to purchase these supplies before needing them in class.

Check your Email Regularly

- Important program information is sent to the email you entered in your application.
- While in Canada you should check your email daily.
 - You do not want to miss out on information about activities, sightseeing trips, skiing/snowboarding, and many other opportunities.




